How I LIVE UNITED MY NAME IS DAN.

I'm the director at Bethel Hope. Assisting people in the Tipp City, Monroe, and Bethel Township areas.

Tom first came to our Bethel Hope office right after Christmas, 2010. His back was in a brace, and he had some difficulty getting down the stairway.

He was working for a small family owned business. He had been making a living for many years as a masonry man, specializing in chimney construction and repairs. Though he was very used to working in high places, in the fall of 2010, his luck ran out. He fell down from a ladder, breaking a bone in his spine. It was fortunate he wasn't paralyzed. The doctors were able to repair his broken bone, but during his recovery, he was in great pain and barely able to get around. Working was not an option.

That December day, Bethel Hope wrote a check to Tom's landlord to help with his rent. He also selected a supply of food to take home with him (we carried the food to his car for him).

Tom returned to Bethel Hope in February to get additional food. In March, he returned a third time for more food and for financial assistance with a utility bill.

In April, Tom was able to return to work. Thanks to United Way and all other contributors to Bethel Hope, Tom was able to weather his injury without being hungry or losing his home or having his utilities shut off. Tom is one of many examples of how your contributions to United Way make a difference in our community.

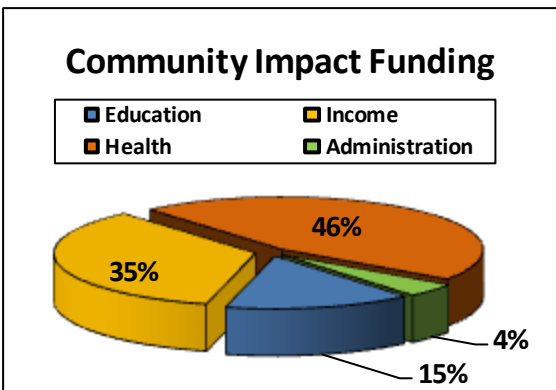
